WC Kids Ministry Continues To Grow


Our WC Kids Ministry has seen exciting and unprecedented growth over the last couple of years. In fact, we've welcomed over 150 new families in just the last 12 months. In 2024, we had our largest Vacation Bible School in history, with 1,064 kids and more than 300 volunteers (we actually ran out of room). And while all of this is good news, our WC Kids Ministry leaders need additional space to engage the hearts and minds of our little ones for Jesus Christ. The need is now; but so, too, is the solution. With your help, when our Student Ministry is relocated to their new facility, WC Kids will expand into the second floor of the current Student Education Building – nearly doubling their ministry space!



A New Gathering Space For WC Students

The complexion of ministry with teenagers has changed. Right now, the challenges they're facing are more daunting than ever. Isolation. Fear. Anxiety. Doubt. We are seeking to construct a space that's warm, welcoming and inspiring – a place where youth can connect to God, to each other, to themselves, and to a lifelong relationship with the Church. This project is a logical next step, too: with the phenomenal growth of our WC Kids Ministry, this facility will maximize our ability to continue to serve those families as their kids move into WC Students. The building will house a gym as well as flexible spaces to be used for worship, discipleship, and other recreational ministries for WC families as well as the surrounding community.

COUNSELING CENTER & SPIRITUAL CARE

So much happens in that little house up on the hill. It hosts a number of spiritual formation classes, the Counseling Center, and one of the largest chapters of Alcoholics Anonymous in Tarrant County. So much amazing ministry and deep soul care is taking place in a facility that has some serious limitations and infrastructural concerns – all of which will be addressed: with spacious meeting areas, private spaces for consultations, an elevator, and the relocation of the WC contemplative garden. We believe that now is the time to build a new dedicated space that would create opportunities to develop, deepen, and expand those ministries into a community that needs them. In addition, as our addiction ministry (Chandler's Hope) continues to grow, this will be a wonderful place for healing and hope to happen.



LA MESA

Right now, the embers of a thriving community are sparking to life. Our La Mesa community outreach center (formerly, El Buen Samaritano) is already at work in the schools and neighborhoods in east Fort Worth, spreading the love and grace of God! Worship services are already meeting. Discipleship groups are already forming. And lives are already being changed with the Good News of the Gospel! And all this is happening without any permanent space to call home. This new facility, working in partnership with the WC Mission Health dental clinic next door, will address the very real issues facing our brothers and sisters downtown – spiritually, physically, and emotionally. With a designated worship space and other rooms for community support and education, the center will make a Kingdom-sized impact for the name of Jesus Christ!





SANCTUARY RENOVATION

Every weekend, we say it: that we are extraordinarily blessed. Regardless of which service you attend, the quality of our worship is second to none. Whether it's the WC Choir and Orchestra leading us into the transcendent presence of the Almighty, or it's the Praise Team and band inviting us to reflect upon the powerful and intimate relationship Christ desires, the WC worship experience is changing lives... but right now, we are at capacity. Both as a technical matter and as a practical one, the choir loft and platform are filled. An expansion would allow for others to find their place in this ministry and to find their voice (literally) in leading God's people in worship. The plan calls for expanding the choir loft, orchestra space, and the chancel/platform while also creating new production spaces for our teams to use. In addition, this concept makes the chancel area fully accessible to those with mobility issues.

FOUNDRY RENOVATION

The Foundry is the space on our campus that has seen the most change over the life of the church. It's been many things and gone by many names. Right now, we have the opportunity to benefit both our weekend services as well as the six yearly productions of our thriving theater ministry. In addition, this improvement will create a more conducive space for the myriad of seasonal events that happen in The Foundry throughout the year.

 We are also studying creative ways to help people move across our campus and within our buildings.

Our primary focus must always be on our tithing in support of the life-changing ministries of the church. We would love for every member and supporter of our ministry to participate as they are able. In preparation of what's to come, we hope to stir up enthusiasm by sharing the story of White's Chapel. Be on the lookout for people who are searching for a solid, Christ-centered church home. TIMELINE

2024

September – November

December



January – February

February

Phase One: WC Town Hall Meetings (in person and online) & Small Group Gatherings.

We will take a break from our capital campaign during the season of Advent to celebrate the birth of our Savior.

Phase Two: WC Town Hall Meetings (in person and online) & Small Group Gatherings.

Leading up to our Pledge Weekend, be looking forward to a special "Now & Always" celebration event.

February 22 - 23 Pledge Weekend: During each of our worship services, we will have a special time of prayer and dedication. Once pledges are received, our Administrative Board will vote on the scope and the sequence of the proposed projects (the response of our congregation will determine the scope/size of our build). This will authorize our architects and Building Committee to prepare construction documents, seek city approval, and put the project out for formal bids – in all, this is a process that can take anywhere from 9 to 12 months.

2026

February

Once we have a final proposal and fixed pricing, the Administrative Board will, again, review the plans and consider authorizing construction. Depending on the projects approved, construction will take 9 to 12 months.

2027

February – December As each space is completed, we will begin occupying them. We will, with the help of our architects, ensure that none of our ministries or worship services will be negatively affected by the construction process.
